
The Viola da Gamba Society of America Young Players' Weekend March 28-30, 2025 - Madison, Wisconsin

Meet the Faculty



JOANNA BLENDULF is Professor of Music (Historical Performance) at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. She has performed and recorded with leading period instrument ensembles and is currently co-principal cellist and principal viola da gamba player of the Portland Baroque Orchestra. Ms Blendulf has also performed as principal cellist of Pacific MusicWorks, Pacific Baroque Orchestra, American Bach Soloists, Apollo's Fire Baroque Orchestra, Bach Collegium San Diego, and the

Washington Bach Consort. Joanna performs and records with the Catacoustic Consort, Ensemble Mirable, Music of the Spheres, Nota Bene Viol Consort, Trio Pardessus, and Wildcat Viols. Ms Blendulf's world-premiere recording of the complete cello sonatas of Jean Zewalt Triemer with Ensemble Mirable was released in 2004. Her festival engagements have included performances at Tage Alter Musik Regenburg, Musica Antigua en Villa de Leyva, the Bloomington, Boston and Berkeley Early Music Festivals, the Ojai Music Festival, and the Carmel and Oregon Bach Festivals. Ms Blendulf holds degrees with honors from the Cleveland Institute of Music and the IU Jacobs School of Music where she was awarded the prestigious Performer's Certificate for her accomplishments in early music performance.



ERICA RUBIS (Month of Maying and Marginalia) is a versatile performer on the viola da gamba whose work ranges from renaissance viol consort to improvising and co-creating new music. She is a member of Alchymy Viols, Les Ordinaires Trio, and also plays with Bourbon Baroque, Catacoustic Consort, Echoing Air, Indianapolis Baroque Orchestra, and North Carolina Baroque Orchestra. She also collaborates and performs regularly with composer/performer Tomás Lozano in his song project on the poetry of

Juan Ramón Jiménez.

Erica's recordings include Les Ordinaires, Inner Chambers and Monteclair: Beloved and Betrayed, contemporary music of Tomas Lozano, Eternal Juan Ramón Jiménez, and The Colorful Telemann with the Indianapolis Baroque Orchestra.

Active in music education, Erica holds regular workshops on the viola da gamba for string students and has pioneered a multi-media program, Shakespeare's Ear, which has been touring regularly since 2009.



ERIC MILLER (YPW Director) performs as a viola da gambist and cellist around the Midwest, currently performing with the Wisconsin Baroque Ensemble, Generations Baroque, and frequent solo recitals. Beyond the sphere of classical music, he has recorded several hours of lo-fi electronic music with his electronic duo, Basidium. Eric is a dedicated educator and currently teaches orchestra in the Oregon School District, where he also coaches a youth viol consort. Trained in the Suzuki method, Eric maintains a private cello studio for all ages and abilities at his home in Madison. He has taught at the Madison Early Music Festival, the Blue Lake Family Suzuki Camp, and the Madison Bach Musicians Summer Chamber Music workshop. He holds degrees from

Northern Illinois University and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.
